CITY PARKS FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES ING AS MULTI-YEAR TITLE SPONSOR OF GREEN GIRLS PROGRAM

Three-Year Sponsorship of the Environmental Education Program for Middle School Girls Begins This Spring "CityParks Green Girls Empowered by ING"

April 22, 2020 - New York, NY - In celebration of Earth Day, City Parks Foundation and ING Americas announce a three-year partnership to support the CityParks Green Girls program. CityParks Green Girls Empowered by ING is an innovative science-and STEM-based after school and summer program that inspires early adolescent girls to excel as environmental scientists and see their potential as stewards of New York City's precious natural resources.

Nearly 20 years ago, in order to increase awareness among young New Yorkers about the important role that green space plays in mitigating environmental impacts, while also addressing the dearth of science programs for girls and evidence of girls' lagging science scores, City Parks Foundation created Green Girls to excite young women in 6th-8th grade, living in under-resourced neighborhoods, about STEM learning. Today, as New Yorkers shelter at home, their only respite is their neighborhood public park, which remains open and free to use to support their physical, mental, and emotional health. The mission of the Green Girls is more important than ever, teaching the next generation of city dwellers to steward these crucial -- and fundamentally democratic -- public resources.

Through this new ING partnership, City Parks Foundation will double the size of its experiential summer intensive program for young New Yorkers beginning in 2021. It will also adapt the Green Girls curriculum and make it available to teachers around the country, free of charge, beginning in late 2020. The digital curriculum will be offered free for download and will require teachers to participate in an online learning session with City Parks Foundation educators beforehand and to report on their program outcomes to inform and help shape future curriculum updates. The curriculum will include suggested lesson plans, tips on establishing partnerships, and advocacy tools to help instructors run a successful program. The digital curriculum will be made available at cityparksfoundation.org/learn.

The Green Girls transform NYC's public parklands, forests and waterways into learning laboratories, as they engage in hands-on experiments and community service. Students interact with a wide range of primarily female environmentalists and scientists, such as park rangers, foresters, ornithologists, and wildlife experts, to learn about a variety of potential careers in the sciences - an industry where over 75% of the workforce is male. In addition to STEM lessons, the program also facilitates social-emotional learning at this critical time in a young woman's development, through discussions that are often led by former students who have advanced to paid internships; and team-building activities focused on female empowerment, individual voice, and self-awareness, aiming to foster healthy relationship development between students.

"We are thrilled about our new partnership for the Green Girls program," said **Heather Lubov**, **Executive Director of City Parks Foundation.** "ING takes sustainability very seriously, and has developed a comprehensive corporate policy that demonstrates its long-term commitment to improving climate outcomes.
