POSITION SUMMARY

For over 20 years, CPF Education has implemented experiential learning in environmental science, connecting kids to parklands as learning laboratories. Through intensive partnerships with schools and community partners, our vision is to foster year-round, long-term engagement of youth from targeted, underserved communities in five program areas: Seeds to Trees, Learning Gardens, Green Girls, Coastal Classroom, and High School Internships.

City Parks Foundation seeks a Part-Time Environmental Educator to work during the summertime within the Coastal Classroom program. This program is a partnership between CP Learn and Fresh Air Fund, and will take place at Socrates Sculpture Park and the adjacent Hallet's Cove Park. The focus is on educating middle school students about marine ecology, stewardship, and conservation while providing waterfront fun in the outdoors during the summertime.. The program will provide hands-on outdoor field experiences in the waterfront park in a safe environment framed within strict social distance and personal protection protocols. The Part-Time Educator would be in charge of implementing established lessons drawn from the Coastal Classrooms current curricula.

REQUIREMENTS

- Provide direct instruction in a park using pre-planned activities from the Coastal Classroom curricula for middle school students. The program will span three 2-week sessions with students rotating between sports and education activities each day between 9am and 2pm. Each two weeks a new cohort of students will be enrolled.
- Participate in safety training related to avoiding the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- Agree to sign a waiver regarding the strict use of training protocols and willingness to collaborate with onsite staff and to manage groups in such a way that students do the same.
- Opportunity to work with the Associate Director of Environmental Education and other staff to help shape curricula by recommending activities and providing relevant feedback.
- Assist to implement program evaluation and student assessment strategies and tools.
- Assist in maintaining education department resources including educational gear, and supplies as well. While students will be given most materials to keep (so as to avoid sharing), this will include sanitizing some equipment for daily use.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor's Degree in Education, Environmental Education/Science, Environmental Studies or equivalent direct experience in environmental science education in non-formal settings
- A minimum of two years of teaching experience with outdoor and experiential learning desirable
- Strong experience with middle school-age students desirable
- Demonstrated success working with diverse students, especially youth from under-resourced communities
- Excellent written and verbal communication as well as problem-solving skills
- Strong proficiency in Google Drive and Office applications (docs, sheets, slides)
- Willingness to work outdoors in sometimes uncomfortable weather conditions
- The ability to work both independently and as part of a team is essential.
- NYS Drivers License and the ability to travel throughout NYC a plus.
- Self-starter with a positive, can-do attitude and consistent follow-through.
