ABOUT CITY PARKS FOUNDATION

City Parks Foundation (CPF) is the only independent, nonprofit organization whose mission is to offer programs in public parks throughout the five boroughs of New York City. We are dedicated to invigorating and transforming parks into dynamic, vibrant centers of urban life through sports, arts, community development, and education programs for all New Yorkers. Our programs and community building initiatives -- located in more than 400 parks, recreation centers, and public schools across New York City -- reach 300,000 people each year. Our ethos is simple: we believe thriving parks mean thriving communities.

POSITION SUMMARY

Catalyst, a program of Partnerships for Parks (PfP), harnesses the resources of City Parks Foundation, NYC Parks, and local partners to strengthen and center community building around improving high needs parks in historically underserved neighborhoods. Catalyst increases opportunities for community members to contribute to community life via neighborhood parks. We connect engaged community members into networks and groups that become caretakers, advocates, programmers, and leaders for their parks. Catalyst objectives in the upcoming work includes: developing local groups and community networks; deepening the collaboration with NYCHA residents, fostering health and wellness programming in parks, being an effective collaborator with NYC Parks and various local NYC government agencies; encouraging peer learning and best practice sharing throughout our community of Catalyst and PfP partners. Catalyst Organizers will lead engagement in up to 4 community sites at any given time, which shift every 18 - 36 months. The work of each Catalyst Organizer will be concentrated in a particular borough, in this case Brooklyn, where substantial in-person work in parks, community settings, and NYC Parks offices will be required.

Catalyst Organizers are expected to work as part of a team and report to the Director of Catalyst.

REQUIREMENTS

- Invest in and achieve consistent, effective, and collaborative relationships with key stakeholder groups,

starting with these core groups: Community members/partners, and Partnerships for Parks, City Parks Foundation and NYC Parks staff members.

- Through asset mapping and onsite/neighborhood outreach, events, and other activations, identify stakeholders interested in caring for their park and community
- Facilitate communication and collaboration among interested partners. Cultivate partnerships with intensive, customized support and collaboration
- Develop a thorough understanding of assigned Catalyst parks and local issues, demographics and opportunities
- Support the leadership development of local partners as ongoing, sustainable park and waterfront stewards by connecting them to Partnerships for Parks and other hands-on park projects, events, skill building, and engagement opportunities
- Conduct ongoing coaching for partners in alignment with Catalyst goals
- Support, assist, document, highlight, promote, and advance partner and Partnerships for Parks efforts in and around Catalyst parks
- Serve as a visible, in-community and park presence, acting as an effective liaison between community partners and NYC Parks, CPF and other organizations, mindful of the needs and interests all all parties
- Connect and leverage local and regional resources to support and amplify community partner efforts
- Track Catalyst work in database - maintain individual and organizational records, input outcomes and other important details as determined by the Catalyst Director
- Develop internal and external reports as needed
- Participate in work plan development and strategic planning
- Work closely with Catalyst Director and CPF fundraising team to inform fundraising plans and reporting
- Support ongoing Partnerships for Parks/City Parks Foundation/NYC Parks initiatives as needed, working collaboratively and effectively as needed. Tasks and assignments will come from all three areas of our organization. Catalyst team members are accountable to and receive direction/assignments from each area of our public/private program

QUALIFICATIONS

- Demonstrable ability to work with diverse constituencies
- Understanding and ability to effectively represent and advance NYC government programs and policies. Clarity at all times we are working with and at the behest of NYC Parks and NYC government
- Community organizing, coalition-building, public service/administration, and/or programming experience - degree in related field helpful and preferred, but not required
- Strong public speaking, writing, and listening skills
- Catalyst is traditionally a place-based, on-the-ground engagement effort and requires:
 - Willingness and ability to consistently engage with stakeholders through in-person and digital engagements, including frequent travel around NYC and regular, on-site work.
 - Flexibility to work significant hours during evenings and weekends in addition to regular business hours
- Motivated, resourceful, and creative self-starter with a passion for sustainable community engagement who is confident working both individually and as part of a team
- Responsible, detail-oriented, and organized project manager
- Experience planning community-led events and/or collaborative projects that feature multiple stakeholders and interests
- Comfort and facility with office software and Google apps
- Experience with qualitative and quantitative data collection
- Physical ability to lift up to 40lbs and participate in physical activities required in the job. This includes the ability to provide direct support in leading stewardship, landscaping and beautification projects in parks plus a range of community and park events, including transporting, setup and breakdown of event materials
