
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ABOUT CITY PARKS FOUNDATION

ABOUT THE COMPANY

When Alvin Ailey and a small group of African American dancers took the stage on March 30, 1958 at New York City's 92nd Street Y, it was the start of a new era in the arts. Mr. Ailey envisioned a company dedicated to enriching the American modern dance heritage and preserving the uniqueness of the African American cultural experience. The Company has performed for an estimated 25 million people on six continents, as well as millions more through television, film, and online. In 2008, a U.S. Congressional resolution designated the Company as "a vital American cultural ambassador to the world." Before his untimely death in 1989, Mr. Ailey named Judith Jamison as his successor, and over the next 21 years, she brought the Company to unprecedented success. Ms. Jamison, in turn, personally selected Robert Battle to succeed her in 2011, and *The New York Times* declared he "has injected the company with new life."
