CITY PARKS FOUNDATION KICKS OFF FREE SPRING YOUTH ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS IN NYC PARKS AND WATERWAYS



REGISTRATION FOR 2024 SPRING PROGRAMS NOW OPEN

MARCH 5, 2024 - New York, NY - <u>City Parks Foundation</u> is excited to open registration for their Spring <u>Learn</u> environmental education programs. The programs provide free and low-cost experiential STEM programs to students in all five boroughs. Students are able to participate in the free hands-on curricula in NYC's parks and coastlines focusing on coastal waterways, food systems, the local urban environment and more.

Teachers and school administrators throughout New York are encouraged to apply to bring these STEM programs to their schools. They can also apply for City Parks Foundation's Experiential Learning teacher training classes. Participants learn advanced skills on how to teach immersive lessons in New York's parks or community gardens. They can achieve CTLE professional development credits for teachers by New York State, which can be used toward their salary differentials.

<u>Green Girls</u> inspires middle school girls in 6th - 8th grades to embrace the identity of environmental scientists and get excited about STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) through immersive environmental programs within NYC's parks. *See dates, times and locations below.*

Coastal Classroom takes place along the city's waterways to help foster STEM learning through immersive lessons in NYC's marine ecosystems focused on coastal resilience, marine ecosystems, and more, for 6th - 8th graders. Learning Gardens foster a love of science and nature among students in 2nd - 8th grades who are living in some of NYC's most densely populated neighborhoods in the Bronx, Brooklyn and Queens. Students learn community horticulture through fun, hands-on lessons growing food, identifying biodiversity in our urban environment, and more. <u>Seeds to Trees</u> partners skilled science educators with schools teaching 2nd - 6th grade students to provide hands-on classroom activities, field experiences in parks and expert teacher training. *See dates, times and locations below.*
