

# CITY PARKS FOUNDATION AND PARTNERSHIPS FOR PARKS ANNOUNCE \$375,000 IN GRANTS FOR 69 COMMUNITY GROUPS PROVIDING NEEDED CARE AND PROGRAMS FOR PARKS AND OPEN SPACES ACROSS NYC

# NYC GREEN FUND GRASSROOTS GRANTS WILL PROVIDE NECESSARY FUNDING TO VOLUNTEER GROUPS DOING THE CRITICAL WORK OF SUSTAINING LOCAL PARKS

Funding supports community-based solutions to issues including environmental and social resilience, global heating, and food justice

**November 7, 2024 -- New York, NY --** Today, **City Parks Foundation** and **Partnerships for Parks** announced the selection of 50 new grant recipients as well as 19 grantees receiving second year funding through the 2024 fall round of the **NYC Green Fund** Grassroots grants program. What started as an emergency response program in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic has expanded into a long-term campaign to provide financial, network, and technical support for open space stewards as we continue to face significant environmental, economic, and social challenges as a city. From cleaning our air, cooling our neighborhoods, and preventing flooding, to benefitting the mental and physical health and social cohesion of our communities, our city's green spaces are critical infrastructure. Many urban green spaces, particularly in historically underserved communities, rely on the support of grassroots volunteers to provide the care and programming needed to ensure they are clean, green, active, and safe.

The current round of the NYC Green Fund Grassroots grant program seeks to address this disparity with grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$22,400 to support stewardship and activation of local parks and open spaces across our city with live arts and culture, environmental action, tree canopy expansion, youth development, and health and wellness programming. The Grassroots grants program focuses on Environmental Justice Areas, majority BIPOC-led community groups, and groups with budgets under \$50,000; targeting communities that are vulnerable to excessive environmental harms resulting from historic and ongoing inequities including structural racism and disinvestment.

The vision of the NYC Green Fund is to create a resilient and equitable NYC parks ecosystem for the benefit of all New Yorkers. The Fund is administered by City Parks Foundation with the Grassroots grants program managed by Partnerships for Parks (PfP), a joint program of City Parks Foundation and NYC Parks.



"As we work together with New York City communities to sustain our local parks, we are overjoyed to announce another round of support from the NYC Green Fund Grassroots grant program," said Sabina Saragoussi, director of Partnerships for Parks. "This much-needed funding not only helps our community partners beautify and activate neighborhood green space, but also helps tackle the urgent issues of our time; cooling our city, cleaning our air, and strengthening community health."

"From an emergency fund created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, to a lifeline of support for open space stewards across our city, the NYC Green Fund has had an impact on millions of New Yorkers who use their local green spaces," said Heather Lubov, executive director of City Parks Foundation. "We are thrilled to be able to support community groups doing the crucial work of green space care with this latest round of grassroots grants."

The funded projects provide innovative, community-based solutions to our most pressing needs, including environmental and social resilience, global heating, food justice, climate justice, emission reduction, environmental education, health disparities, accessibility, gun violence, teen mental health, and more.

### New project highlights:

- Friends of Colonel Young Park will transform a neglected, flood-prone corner of a Harlem park into a rain garden with flood-resistant shrubs.
- **Narrows Botanical Gardens Inc** will partner with a visually impaired artist to create a sensory garden that can be enjoyed by people of all abilities in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn.
- St. George Civic Association will engage community volunteers and local businesses to rehabilitate neglected tree beds along a busy shopping corridor on Staten Island.
- **Astoria Pug** will expand their composting collection and soil revitalization work, using locally generated food waste to care for neighborhood trees in Queens.
- Washington's Walk Coalition in the Bronx will hire local youth leaders to aid with urban forestry education and ongoing tree care throughout next summer.
- Rodale Pleasant Park Community Garden in East Harlem will establish a new food scrap drop-off program, collaborate with the local park to repurpose leaf debris into garden mulch, and hold workshops on at-home composting.
- Are You Ready Community Outreach Inc will offer chess workshops for at-risk youth and pay youth leaders to carry out group beautification projects before and after each event in Bed Stuy, Brooklyn.
- Friends of Livonia Park will organize a series of discussions and stewardship events for local teens to share and learn from one another about the issues of gun violence, mental health, and body image in Brownsville, Brooklyn.
