



CITY PARKS FOUNDATION ANNOUNCED 40+ ORGANIZATIONS AWARDED \$900,000 IN NYC GREEN FUND TREETOPS GRANTS

GRANTS WILL SUPPORT NYC STEWARDSHIP PROJECTS FOCUSED ON ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION, ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT, AND MORE

January 2, 2026 - New York, NY - Today, City Parks Foundation announced recipients of the [NYC Green Fund](#)'s Treetops program, to mid-sized organizations that program, steward, and advocate for parks and open spaces across NYC's five boroughs. Thirty five new projects were awarded first-time grants, and second-year grants to 8 additional projects. The Treetops grant program supports an equitable and resilient network of parks and open spaces to benefit the well-being of all New Yorkers.

This year's grant funding will support a range of programming and stewardship-focused projects, as well as open space improvements and green workforce development. This year, \$775,000 will go to 35 organizations through grants ranging from \$10,000 up to \$38,000, with an average grant size of \$22,000. An additional \$118,000 will go towards 8 projects continuing on for a second year. The Fund is administered by City Parks Foundation.

"The Treetops program helps mid-size organizations across NYC steward, maintain, and activate our green and open spaces through critical projects emphasizing the importance of our parks as New Yorkers' backyards," said **Heather Lubov, executive director of City**



Parks Foundation. “We are looking forward to all of the great work that grantees will undertake this year thanks to the NYC Green Fund.”

The funded projects provide innovative opportunities for New Yorkers to get involved in their communities and will address pressing needs in our city, including coastal restoration, tree care, expansion of the urban forest, and more.

Additional project highlights across the five boroughs include:

- **Bronx River Alliance, Inc. (Bronx) - Coastal Restoration and Community Engagement in Soundview Park, South Bronx**
 - To facilitate volunteers to clear 1.5 acres of invasive weeds and plant 600 trees and 200 shrubs. The project site is directly on the coastline of Long Island Sound in Soundview Park, and will include educational outreach to the community.
- **Fast Feet Running and Athletics, Inc. (Brooklyn, Bronx) - Movement for All: Expanding Adaptive Fitness in Williamsburg, Bay Ridge, and the Bronx**
 - To expand adaptive running programs in McCarren Park, Bay Ridge, and the South Bronx, longstanding sites with strong community ties and growing demand. Funding will help reduce waitlists by adding additional practice sessions and deepening recreational access for youth with disabilities.
- **Freshkills Park Alliance (Staten Island) - Freshkills Park: Rare Grassland Nursery Education and Stewardship Programs**
 - To engage students, volunteers, and community members in native plant horticulture and habitat restoration at the rare grassland nursery and teaching garden.
- **Gotham Park (Manhattan) - Expanding Gotham Park’s Volunteer-Powered Stewardship**
 - To expand volunteer-powered stewardship programs that maintain and beautify Gotham Park, serving thousands of Lower Manhattan youth, elders, and families.
- **Lewis Latimer House Museum (Queens) - Lewis Latimer House STEAM Programming, Youth Engagement & City of Forest Day Event**



- Increase the number of STEAM programs and workshops in the newly beautified garden space at the Lewis Latimer House, and engage youth in the ongoing stewardship of the space alongside our partners, the Green Earth Urban Gardens and the Horticultural Society of New York.
